Almost 400 students of architecture from around the world are registered to participate in the student confrontation organised as part of the upcoming UIA congress in Durban (3-7 August 2014). The competition brief was developed to spotlight the complex ecology of the Warwick Junction site in Durban: a hub for the city's transportation networks as well as informal communications and commerce. Participants are asked to imagine solutions that will benefit both the local community and the half a million people who pass through Warwick Junction every day. The jury is composed of Rahul Mehrotra, Tasmi Quazi, Luyanda Mphahlwa, Joe Osae-Addoet and Mariana Jiménez Calderón.

## GRAND PRIZE FOR FRENCH ARCHITECTURE OVERSEAS

The Grand Prize for French architecture overseas (AFEX), was attributed on 17 December, to the Cidade das Artes in Rio de Janeiro, realised by Christian de Portzamparc. The concrete building that both pays tribute to Brazilian architecture and demonstrates the iconic of Christian de Portzamparc's work convinced the jury. Paul Andreu, who also competed this year with the Grand Theatre in Jinan, was awarded a special prize for his body of work in China. The APEX prizes recompense internationally recognised designers whose work expresses the vitality of French architecture on the international scene.

## 24 HOURS OF ARCHITECTURE SECOND EDITION

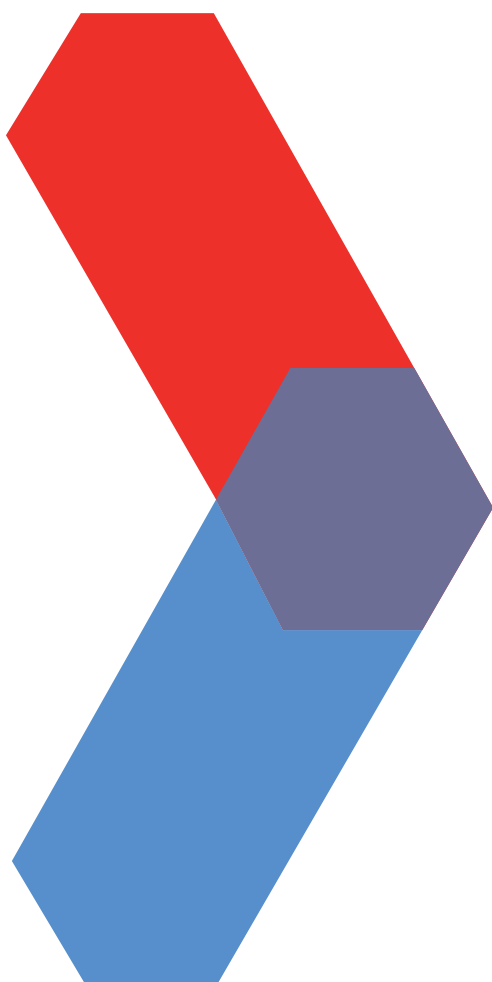
Following the first edition in Strasbourg in 2012, the second "24 Hours of Architecture" event organised by the French network of *Maisons de l'architecture* will take place in Marseille, on 17 & 18 October 2014. Two themes will be developed: Prettier cities and Adventure. The president of the Marseille Architecture and City Centre (*Maison de l'architecture et de la ville* - MAV), André Jollivet, will serve as curator for the event.

The *Maisons de l'architecture* and the Marseille Municipality will coordinate educational activities, walking tours, artistic interventions and a variety of other programmes yet to be announced. A number of active local associations are privileged partners in these activities and will provide the link between architecture and the city. The centre for these events will be the *Friche Belle de Mai*, an old tobacco factory converted into a cultural centre.
